OLOL

Dear Friends,

One pillar of our Catholic beliefs is that hospitality is a Christian obligation that involves welcoming others and serving their needs. It's a way to put faith into action and be a companion to others. Hospitality is embodied in liturgy, which is the action of Christ and the Church.

For many years, OLOL has been welcoming Neocatechumenal Way, Korean and Maronite communities. Because of the sale of the chapel at Marymount in Castle Hill by the Sisters of Mercy, Christ the Redeemer Maronite Catholic Community (CTRC) is looking for a new place of worship by the end of February 2025 until their new church at Dural is built.

Mgsr. Shora Maree, parish priest of CTRC, has approached the Diocese and us for assistance.

A community discussion night at OLOL on 18th January was held to discuss CTRC proposal of Mass schedule and financial offer.

As a result, the offer and the proposal to change the Sunday mass from 9.30am to 9am were endorsed. The change of Vigil to 5.30pm (combined Mass with CTRC) has not been accepted. There were some concerns about the proposed alternative schedule of the Vigil mass, i.e. 5pm for OLOL and 6.30pm for CTRC. Having listened to the concerns and having discussed them with Mgsr. Shora, I have decided not to change the schedule of the Vigil mass which will remain at 6pm for now. While there is no change for the weekday schedule, the weekend schedule is the following: Vigil at 6pm - 7pm (Neocatechumenal Way community OLOL Hall); Sunday: 9am OLOL - 10.30am CTRC followed by baptism at 11.45am - 1pm Korean community - 6pm CTRC. CTRC will also use the hall under the church for their children's liturgy on Sundays. Hence, OLOL morning tea can take place in the community centre after 9am mass. The Christmas and Easter schedule for OLOL remains mostly the same, except the Holy Thursday's Lord Supper at 7.30pm and Good Friday Veneration of the Cross at 3pm will be at St Michael's only to allow CTRC to celebrate these important liturgical celebrations. Their Holy Week liturgy, also called divine liturgy, may take up to two and half hours. Because of their seize and length of liturgy, it is difficult to find another church to celebrate. Our parish is the only one in the Hills district with two churches!

Also, Mgsr. Shora and I have discussed the parking situation at OLOL and other safety issues. Compliance with traffic regulations is important to us. I expect a smooth transition.

For the use of OLOL facilities, CTRC will contribute 75% of the annual insurance premium and cost of utilities. Furthermore, CTRC will also maintain and upgrade the church's IT system, including the replacement of the old projectors with 2 large TV screens and speakers. CTRC is also prepared to improve the cooling of the church building via AC or upgrade of the ceiling fans. Most importantly, CTRC will be responsible for the general maintenance of the outdoor areas around the church and house!

What are the next steps? CTRC, the diocese and us are working on a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). After the signing of the agreement, MOU will be effective from Sunday 23rd February 2025.

I believe that CTRC offer is generous and would assist us in our

current financial situation. Most importantly, the maintenance of OLOL ground and infrastructure is ensured for the next two years. In this manner, OLOL is preserved as a place of worship for us and for all other worshipping communities as well. I think it is a WIN WIN situation for all involved.

I would like to thank your Maronite sisters and brothers for their cooperation and generosity. Welcome to our parish!

Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

First Reading Mal 3:1-4

The Lord God says this: Look, I am going to send my messenger to prepare a way before me. And the Lord you are seeking will suddenly enter his temple; and the angel of the covenant whom you are longing for, yes, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. Who will be able to resist the day of his coming? Who will remain standing when he appears? For he is like the refiner's fire and the fuller's alkali. He will take his seat as refiner and purifier; he will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, and then they will make the offering to the Lord as it should be made. The offering of Judah and Jerusalem will then be welcomed by the Lord as in former days, as in the years of old.

Second Reading Heb 2:14-18

Since all the children share the same blood and flesh, Jesus too shared equally in it, so that by his death he could take away all the power of the devil, who had power over death, and set free all those who had been held in slavery all their lives by the fear of death. For it was not the angels that he took to himself; he took to himself descent from Abraham. It was essential that he should in this way become completely like his brothers so that he could be a compassionate and trustworthy high priest of God's religion, able to atone for human sins. That is, because he has himself been through temptation he is able to help others who are tempted.

Lk 2:22-40

When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord – observing what stands written in the Law of the Lord: Every first-born male must be consecrated to the Lord – and also to offer in sacrifice, in accordance with what is said in the Law of the Lord, a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.

Now in Jerusalem there was a man named Simeon. He was an upright and devout man; he looked forward to Israel's comforting and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit he came to the Temple; and when the



parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required, he took him into his arms and blessed God, and he said:

'Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace, just as you promised;

because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel.'

As the child's father and mother stood there wondering at the things that were being said about him, Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, 'You see this child: he is destined for the fall and for the rising of many in Israel, destined to be a sign that is rejected – and a sword will pierce your own soul too – so that the secret thoughts of many may be laid bare.'

There was a prophetess also, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was well on in years. Her days of girlhood over, she had been married for seven years before becoming a widow. She was now eighty-four years old and never left the Temple, serving God night and day with fasting and prayer. She came by just at that moment and began to praise God; and she spoke of the child to all who looked forward to the deliverance of Jerusalem.

When they had done everything the Law of the Lord required, they went back to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. Meanwhile the child grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him.
